Remote Workers

- Hypothetical No. 1
 - Retail employee provides customers his cell phone number. Customers call the sales representative on that number at times when he is not at work.

Remote Workers

- Hypothetical No. 2
 - Dedicated office clerk reaches out to her supervisor during off hours to discuss status of tasks and to coordinate deadlines. Clerk uses her personal email account.

Remote Workers

- Hypothetical No. 3
 - Managers sent group-wide email or text message requesting status updates from each member of the group. Some of the group members are offduty when the email comes in.

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
