

## Crowell & Moring Promotes Largest Partner Class In Its History

*Law360 (January 11, 2023, 4:10 PM EST)* -- Crowell & Moring LLP promoted 16 partners across 12 practice areas in what is the largest class of promoted partners in the firm's history, it has announced.

Along with those 16 partners, Crowell & Moring tapped five attorneys to become senior counsel. An additional 25 associates were promoted to counsel. The firm's partners were promoted at the firm's offices in Brussels, Chicago, Southern California and Washington, D.C., the firm said Monday.

Philip T. Inglima, chairman of Crowell & Moring, said in a statement that the firm celebrated the attorneys and their "dedication to our clients and professional excellence."

"Their commitment to advancing our clients' goals and our firm mission will ensure their continued success," he said.

The class of promoted partners is the largest in firm history, a Crowell & Moring spokesperson told Law360. In 2021, the firm promoted nine attorneys to partner and in 2022, 13 were elevated to partner, according to the firm. In 2020, Crowell & Moring promoted only eight attorneys to partner.

Attorneys from underrepresented groups make up 88% of the firm's new partner class, including women and people of color.

All the promotions became effective Jan. 1, the firm said. The majority of the firm's new partners are based in Washington, D.C., with 11 of the 16 new partners working from that office.

Elizabeth B. Dawson, a newly promoted partner in the firm's environment and natural resources practice in D.C., said in an email that it meant a lot to her that the firm "has expressed confidence in me and supports the direction I want to take."

"As a partner, I look forward to creating new opportunities to collaborate with clients on their environmental and ESG [environmental, social and corporate governance] strategies, advocacy and litigation," she said.

Tiffany Wynn, another Washington, D.C., partner, also reflected on her promotion in a statement Wednesday.

"Crowell has been my professional home since graduating law school, so this milestone is deeply

meaningful to me," she said. "It's both personally and professionally rewarding to join Crowell's incredible partnership — a community filled with mentors, sponsors, and friends who've supported my development through unique and challenging opportunities — most recently a seven-month stint with a federal public defender's office — and cheered my successes. I'm thrilled to support clients in this new capacity and to continue my professional journey at such a special firm."
